

I got to thinking about the privileges of prayer. First, we are privileged to have a God who invites us at all times and in all situations to come with confidence in prayer. 

GEORGE THAKE: ANOTHER MALTESE STUDENT IN CANADA DURING THE LATTER PART OF THE SECOND WORLD WAR*

Last month, as I was working on the article relating to Robert Joseph Pace, believed to be the only Maltese to immigrate to Canada during World War II, Mark Caruana of NSW, Australia sent me an email stating that the Maltese passport applications for 1944 indicate that George Thake of Senglea, born on November 4, 1926 and the son of Carmelo Thake, was intending to go to Canada.

Thake is certainly an uncommon Maltese surname. According to Mario Cassar, in *The* Was George Thake a direct descendant of William Surnames of the Maltese Islands, it's of English and Carmela (Fenech) Thake? He and Carmela were married in Valletta, on February 11, 1867, in a ceremony presided over by both the Anglican and Roman Catholic clergy. The couple lived at 79, Strada Vittoria, Senglea, and, in addition to George, had a daughter, Harriett.

As for William and Carmela Thake's grandson, the Carmelo (b. Sept. 17, 1896, Senglea), who was a already noted Carmelo Thake, he married Vittoria of Senglea. In addition to aforementioned-George, they also had a son,

> We left the younger George Thake applying for a passport in 1944 to travel to Canada. The travel and immigration records of Canada for this period not being open on line to the public, I could find no actual evidence of George being in that country.

Canada for awhile is gleaned from the fact that, early in September 1944, he boarded the Nederland Line ship Christiann Huygens in Naples and disembarked in Liverpool on September 9th. The next we learn of George, he is a research clerk. In late October 1949, George and a statistician, Lawrence Pace, six years his senior, boarded the British India Steam Navigation Company ship *Oilwara* in the Grand Harbour and arrived at Southampton on November 3rd.

Their destination was the British Tabulating Machine Co. (BTM) in Letchworth, Herfordshire. This was the same company which was called upon to design and manufacture a machine to assist in breaking the German Enigma machine ciphers during the War!

I suspect Thake and Pace were headed for BTM for further training in their field, as the former was a civil servant when he departed from Malta in late 1950, on board the Zim Israel Navigation Line ship *Artsa* and arrived at Plymouth, UK, on October 1st.

His sister-in-law, the former Lina "Ninna" Agius-Gilbert (1931-2017) recalled that George was a student in England when he returned to Malta in in the summer of 1953 to attend the wedding of his brother Charles (December 21 1927, Senglea-May 12, 2018, Malta).

Many will remember this well-known Maltese comedian and actor, Charles Thake.

His and George's father, Carmelo Thake, had risen to the top in Malta's Civil Service by this time. Carmelo had been appointed Official Secretary to the Prime Minister of Malta while Paul Boffa was in office and continued to hold this office during the prime ministerships of Enrico Mizzi, Giorgio Borg Olivier, and Dom Mintoff.

Thus, it should come as no surprise that when Carmelo's son, Charles, was married to Lina Agius-Gilbert at St. Ignatius Church, on August 2, 1953, in St. Julian's, the former prime minister and current minister of health and social services, Dr. Paul Boffa, was Charles' witness, while the then prime minister, Dr. George Borg Olivier, was Lena's witness.



THE PASSING OF DR. JOE AQUILINA*

I learned of the death of Dr. Joseph Nicholas Aquilina, of East Lansing, Michigan, on the day of his passing, Monday, August 21st, on the Facebook page of his daughter, Judge Rosemarie Aquilina.

While I have never met him in person, we had long telephone conversations and exchanged emails, beginning in the latter part of 2018 when I was doing research for the article relating to his family. The article appeared in the January/February 2019 issue of this newsletter.

Joe Aquilina was born in Qrendi, Malta, on March 7, 1935, to Nicholas "Nick" and Mary Rose (Ellul) Aquilina.

I learned of how Joe came out to the United States in November 1952 and joined his father in Detroit. Later, he enlisted in the American Army and served in France and Germany.

I also learned of how his life was saved on August 11, 1956, after missing his plane while oversleeping under a jeep, having been previously reading an article on Gina Lollobrigida in an Italian language magazine. One of the C-119s Joe was supposed to have been on, collided with another, shortly after takeoff, and all the passengers and crew members on the two planes were killed.

That same year, while returning to Germany from a month's leave in Malta and elsewhere, he was bumped by a captain on the flight from Paris to Frankfurt. Later, Joe learned that the plane had crashed and the captain who had taken his seat was killed.

Meanwhile, between these two "miraculous" events in Joe's life, another of the many other reminiscences he shared with me occurred. This was his meeting of his future wife, Joanna, on the "Orient Express" from Paris to West Germany on the last day of August 1956, and how they were married exactly one year later.

After attending medical school at the University of Munich, Joe completed his internship at St. Luke's Hospital in Saginaw, Michigan, and urology residency training at the University of Iowa. He subsequently practised urology for more than 35 years in Saginaw, at St. Luke's Hospital, St. Mary's Hospital, and Saginaw General Hospital. He was able to perform surgery equally well with either hand and told me that the staff used to refer to him as the surgeon with the golden hands.

After his retirement in 2005, Joe started a small vineyard in Mendoza, Argentina. He also continued his study of history, religion, and languages. In addition to Maltese and English, Joe was fluent in German, Italian, and Spanish.

Prior to Parkinson's disease limiting his mobility in recent years, Joe visited Malta and his native town of Qrendi on several occasions. Upon learning of Joe's death, the town's flag on the local council building was lowered to half-mast (see next column) and "half a dozen masses" were to be offered for the repose of his soul.

His Funeral Mass was celebrated at St. Thomas Aguinas Catholic Church, in East Lansing on Thursday, August 24th.

Joe is survived by his widow, five children, 17 siblings.
