



### MEET MARK ANTHONY PACE MALTA'S FIRST RESIDENT HIGH COMMISSIONER TO CANADA

Office of the High Commissioner of the Republic of Malta to Canada



Ambassador Mark A. Pace presented his credentials as the first resident High Commissioner of the Republic of Malta to Canada to Her Excellency the Right Honourable Mary J. May Simon, on 30 April 2024.

Ambassador Pace joined the Maltese diplomatic service in 1995 following the completion of a law degree at the University of Malta. He furthered his studies at the University of Amsterdam, the Netherlands, from where he received a Master of Arts in the Social Sciences in 1998.

Prior to his posting in Ottawa, Ambassador Pace served as the Ambassador of Malta to the Netherlands (2020-2024), Tunisia (2016-2020) and as the Head of the Representative Office of Malta in Ramallah (2012-2015). During his diplomatic career he has also been posted to Moscow (2000-2003), Washington D.C. (2003-2006), the Permanent Representation of Malta to the Council of Europe (2008-2011) and the Permanent Representation of Malta to the European Union (2011-2012).

During different tours of duty at the Ministry for Foreign and European Affairs and Trade, Ambassador Pace held the posts of Head of Unit for Latin America and the Caribbean (2015-2016), Deputy Director of Protocol (2006-2008) and other positions within the multilateral and bilateral divisions.

Ambassador Pace speaks Maltese, English and Italian and has a good working knowledge of Dutch, French, Russian and Spanish.

Ambassador Pace was born on 28 January 1971, in Pietà, Malta. He is married to Mr. Rick Bijkerk.

### PROJECT CHIMBORAZO, THE CLIMB TO INSPIRE

I was born on Monday, March 17, 1980, in Toronto, Ontario.

At the age of 16, while a student at St. Joseph Secondary School in Mississauga, Ontario, a blood test revealed my kidneys were failing and I was eventually diagnosed with Juvenile Nephronophthisis. By the age of 18 my kidney function was down to two percent.

I was in my first year at Sheridan College in Oakville, Ontario, and I chose to do peritoneal dialysis from December 1998 until April 1999 so that I could continue a "normal life" and finish my first year, which I did on Friday, April 23, 1999. Three days later, on Monday, April 26<sup>th</sup>, I received a kidney transplant at Toronto General Hospital at the age of 19 years old. Fortunately, I was a match with my mother, Josie Cefai-Service, who gave me my second chance at life.

Since then, I have been trying to live life to the fullest and travel as much as possible with my beautiful wife, Paulina Jimenez. I do a lot of unconventional things such as snowboarding to camping, scuba diving, sky diving, and more.



### THE JOLLY MAGICIAN

Frank Saviour Ellul was born in 1926 in the village of Zurrieq, in the Republic of Malta. He immigrated to Canada in 1950.

As in the case of the late magician Johnny Giordmaine, Frank was also influenced by viewing a magician at an early age. At the age of 10 he had become adapt in the art of magic.

Upon arrival in Toronto Frank met the famous magician, John Giordmaine, at the old St. Paul the Apostle Church.

Having celebrated my twenty-fifth anniversary with my mother's kidney on April 26, 2024, my next challenge, on September 26<sup>th</sup> of this year, is to summit Mount Chimborazo in Ecuador, which is 6 280 metres above sea level.

This experience is not only one of intense training, but intense fundraising! My goal is to raise \$25,000 - \$1,000 for every year I've had my new kidney – for The Kidney Foundation by the time of my climb. Already, 73 percent towards that goal has been reached.



I'm doing all this to raise awareness that it's not a death sentence to have kidney disease. You can still have aspirations and a goal after a transplant. I chose The Kidney Foundation as my charitable recipient because it helps a lot of people who are going through what I went through.






