

As we approach the feast of St. Michael the Archangel on September 29th, I would like to reflect on the significance of this powerful heavenly protector in our lives and faith.

Why We Pray to Angels and Saints

In the Catholic tradition, we pray to angels and saints because we believe in the Communion of Saints, a spiritual solidarity between the faithful on earth, the souls in purgatory, and the saints in heaven. This practice is rooted in the understanding that those in heaven can intercede for us, offering our prayers to God. As Revelation 5-8 illustrates, the saints in heaven present our prayers to God like golden bowls full of incense! This intercession does not replace Christ's unique mediatorship but complements it, as we seek the support of our heavenly family in our spiritual journey.

St. Michael: Patron of Our Archdiocese [of Toronto]

St. Michael holds a special place in our hearts as the patron of our archdiocese. His name, meaning "Who is like God?" in Hebrew, reflects his role as a defender of the faith and a warrior against evil. 

MOM'S MALTESE COOKBOOK MALTESE COOKING AMERICAN STYLE

In 1981, Mary Buttigieg, a first-generation Maltese wife and mother, published a small, spiral-bound cookbook called Maltese Cooking American Style to preserve and share family recipes passed on to her by her mother and mother-in-law.



These recipes had been handed down for countless generations before her. It was the Maltese food she had taught her daughters to make. Through the years, the book has remained a staple in many Maltese/American households.

rediscovered on the internet and a renewed interest have been modified to meet the tastes and habits of emerged. Only a handful of books were available. Because the original book was published before the digital age, it was impossible to have it reprinted.

It was then that three of Mary's daughters, Esther Haberstroh, Lisa LiGreci, and Annette O'Donohue, were inspired to create their own cookbook.



So, they made a list of recipes, divided them up, and started cooking. They took their own pictures of what they prepared. After spending hours on video chats discussing recipe changes, photo selections, and book formats for almost two years, Esther, Lisa, and Annette are proud to offer a book of which even their mother Mary would be proud.

Mom's Maltese Cookbook is a collaborative effort by the sisters to carry on the tradition of passing down recipes for the tasty Maltese food they grew up eating and now serve to family and friends. It also honors their parents, Vincent and Mary Buttigieg, and their own Maltese heritage.

This book has a combination of traditional recipes Several years after Mary's passing, the book was from the old country along with other recipes that the American lifestyle, such as shortcuts and healthier alternatives, all without sacrificing the authentic Maltese flavor.



The book is only available for purchase in the United States. The cost is \$30 US (plus shipping and handling if needed). Cash or checks only. Copies may be purchased by sending an email to momsmaltesecookbook@gmail.com.

MARIA (GALEA) FARRUGIA MALTA'S OLDEST PERSON ON RECORD

In chatting with the family of the late Charles Bezzina of London, Ontario, both before and after Mass on the weekend of October 5th-6th, I learned that Charlie's first cousin, Maria (Galea) Farrugia, is the oldest person on record in Malta.

Maria was born in Mosta, Malta on March 7, 1912, to Anġlu and Anna Galea. Anġlu was a stevedore whose job involved carrying baskets of coal onto barges at the port. He later went to work at a farm known as *Ta' Viku*, located where the Santa Venera Lidl now stands.

In 1941, Maria married Ġorġ Farrugia with whom she had three children: Anġlu, Josephine, and Karmena. Ġorġ died before reaching the age of 50.

Based on the Public Register, dating back to 1839, it was on June 2, 2023, that Maria surpassed all previous records for longevity among Maltese and Gozitans.

The previous record holder was Ġanni "Il-Giġa" Schembri, who lived to be 111 years, three months, and 25 days before passing away in 1868. Ġanni was born in 1757 and, like Maria (Galea) Farrugia, was also born on a March 7th.

Maria remains the only living person in Malta who lived through World War I (1914-1918), the *Sette Giugno* uprising (June 7 and 9, 1919), and World War II (1939-1945).


