Message from the Honorable Consul General of Malta

Greetings dear friends of the Maltese American Social Club and the Maltese Community in California. Summer is around the corner and with it comes the planning of vacation and maybe a trip to our lovely island of Malta. I wish everyone safe travels and enjoyable vacations.

His Excellency the President of Malta: Earlier this year we received word that His Excellency, Dr. George Vella, President of Malta was planning a visit to San Francisco. Preparations were already on the way, but unfortunately travel schedule could the not accommodate the added time needed for the President to fly to the West Coast to visit us. The President had to limit his visit to Detroit, New York, and Toronto. The Maltese communities in those regions have really stepped up and gave the President of Malta a most warm and wonderful welcome and grand receptions. The Maltese communities arranged for visits to very interesting places such as the Henry Ford Museum which has a lot of connections to Maltese workers at the Ford Motor Company in Detroit, the September 11 Memorial in New York, and many other interesting sites. Hopefully our great and terrific Maltese community in California will have a chance to do the same in the future.

Maltese **Passports** and Maltese Citizenship: Every month we continue to the time take to repeat the announcement that Maltese Citizenship and Maltese passport applications will be processed at the Consulate office in Millbrae. Around the middle of the month of July, if all goes well, an official from the embassy of Malta, in Washington DC, will visit the office of the Consulate of Malta in Millbrae. Those of us who are of Maltese descent are entitled to apply for Maltese citizenship without jeopardizing their US Citizenship. A long waiting list of names of individuals seeking Maltese Citizenship or Maltese passports keeps getting longer. Only applications on the waiting list will be processed.

Maltese History Month

May 30, 1920 ---- The foundation stone of Ta'Pinu Sanctuary is laid in Gharb, Gozo. The official name of the sanctuary is the "Basilica of the National Shrine of the Blessed Virgin of Ta' Pinu." The name Ta' Pinu, which means "of Phillip", comes from a man named Pinu Gauci. who in 1611 gave money for the restoration of the original church, which was in danger of being torn down because it was in state of а disrepair. Pinu also paid an artist named Amadeo Perugino to paint a picture of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin for the main altar. Over the years, many healing miracles have been attributed to prayers to Our Lady of Ta' Pinu. A room at the back of the church contains numerous artifacts, especially crutches, contributed as a testament to miracles by those who have been healed.

May 8, 1945 --- VE (Victory in Europe) Day. The Germans formally surrender to the Allies in Berlin, marking the official end of World War II. General Wilhelm Keitel and two others sign for Germany, while representatives of the United States, the United Kingdom, the Soviet Union, and France sign for the Allies.

Between June 1940 and November 1942 Malta endures relentless bombing by air, first by the Italians and then by the Germans. The tide turns in December of 1942, when the Allies gain the upper hand both in the air and at sea. The fighting continues for two more years, beginning with Axis defeat in North Africa, thanks to the choking off supply lines by Allied forces, followed by the surrender of Italy on May 2, 1945. It ends with the final blow, the destruction and fall of Germany's capital city, Berlin, to forces of the Soviet Union. The Battle of Berlin begins in April 1945 and ends on May 2nd, the same day as the Italian surrender. Six davs later. the unconditional surrender of the German forces is signed.

Origin of Maltese Last Names

Is your last name **Kelly**? If so, you may be interested in knowing where your name comes from. **Kelly** is of Irish origin. It was originally a first name and means "warlike" or "troublesome." It is very common in Ireland, but not common in Malta, where it dates to just the 19th century.
