Message from the President

These incidents have occurred often enough, and also involved enough individuals, that both the Board and I feel it is necessary to offer this reminder about how we communicate with one another. In each situation, those affected could have filed a formal grievance, but all chose not to. This kind of behavior doesn't just affect those directly involved but it can also make others uncomfortable witnessing this type of behavior. We want everyone to feel included, respected and appreciated. It's my sincere hope that this gentle reminder will prompt us all to reflect on how our actions and words may impact others. If you have any questions or concerns, please speak with me directly.

Message from the Honorable Consul General of Malta

Greetings dear friends of the Maltese American Social Club and the Maltese-American Community in California.

Memorial Day: Memorial considered by most as the opening of Summer. The weather may still be a little on the cool side but travel plans are in full swing. But Memorial Day is more than that.....much more and it is good that we pause for a moment and reflect on the significance of this important day. At 3pm on Memorial Day everyone was reminded and encouraged to pause for a moment of silence. For many this day is considered a day of commemoration. It is a day dedicated to those who sacrificed everything to protect and defend every one of us and our country. Its origins date back to the Civil War. It was initially referred to as "Decoration Day." On this day we honor especially our military personnel who lost their lives while serving in the US armed forces. Let us also remember Maltese men and other service people of Maltese descent who served in the US military especially

those who sacrificed everything to protect our freedom and our way of life. Sette Giugno: June 7th in Malta is a public holiday. On June 7th Malta commemorates the upraising of the Maltese public against the invaders while demonstrating against the high cost of living and demanding selfgovernment. On June 7th 1919, large crowds marched on the capital city, Valletta, and demanded to be heard. The march turned into riots as British soldiers tried to hold the crowds back. Against orders, commanding officers, and soldiers opened fire and 4 Maltese protesters were killed. The riots then turned into a rebellion against the British occupiers.

Festa Season during the month of June in Malta & Gozo: The festa season is in full swing in Malta and the hot Summerdays are just around the corner. Almost every week there is a festa in some town or village around Malta and Gozo all the way until September. During the month of June we have the following main festa days: Corpus Christi - Ghasri, Gozo and Rabat, Malta; Our Lady of Fatima -Gwardamanga, Pieta'; St. Joseph -Ghaxaq; St. Philip of Agira - Haz Zebbug; Sacred Heart of Jesus -Fontana, Gozo; Our Lady of Lily -Mgabba; St. Catherine - Zejtun; Our Lady of Lourdes - Qrendi; St. John the Baptist – Xewkija, Gozo; St. Peter & St. Paul Nadur, Gozo; Immaculate Heart of Mary - Burmarrad; St. George - Qormi; St. Nicholas of Bari – Siggiewi. Message From The Secretary Fun Facts:

The scientific term for "brain freeze" is sphenopalatine ganglioneuralgia. Maltese History Month By: Mona Vella-Nicholas

May 31, 1916 - As World War I rages on, the biggest naval battle of the war takes place off the coast of Jutland, Denmark. Over a 24-hour period, eleven German and fourteen British warships are sunk. During the battle, one of the British ships, the HMS Black Prince, loses contact with the other ships in the fleet. What became of the ship does not light until the come to British government gains access to the German report on the battle which stated " Black Prince was hit by at least 12 heavy shells and several smaller ones and sank within 15 minutes, with no survivors of her 857 complement." Among the dead are seven Maltese sailors: Emmanuel Cachia, John Cauchi, Giuseppe Chetcuti, Angelo Formosa, John Micallef, Lewis (Zuigi) Vassallo, and John Rounding out the Maltese connection, two Italian husbands of Maltese women also perish. Although losses are great on both sides, the battle is considered to be a German victory.

May 26, 1934 - Dr. Robert Samut dies in Sliema. Born on October 12, 1869 in Floriana, he goes abroad to study medicine as a young man. After completing his studies in Scotland and England, he returns to Malta, where he becomes a professor at the Royal University of Malta. In addition to his medical work, Dr. Samut has an interest in music. He not only plays with an amateur orchestra, but writes music for the group to play as well. One such piece is a hymn, which is performed not only by his own orchestra, but also by the King's Own Band of Valletta, where it gets broader exposure. Malta's National Poet, Dun Karm Psaila, later writes lyrics to accompany the music. After the first performance of the piece with its lyrics is performed in a concert on December 27, 1922, the work becomes the Maltese national anthem, known today as *L-Innu Malti*.

Origin of Maltese Last Names

Is your last name **Calleja**? If so, you may be interested in knowing where your name comes from. Calleja is of Siculo-Greek origin, which means it comes from a dialect spoken by Greeks living in Sicily. It comes from the Greek word "kalleyias", which means "farmer." A form of this last name appears in Malta as early as 1276. There was once a small village within the limits of what is now Mosta called "Hal Calleya," which means "Calleja's farm."
