Message from the Honorable Consul General of Malta

Greetings dear friends of the Maltese American Social Club and the Maltese Community in California. Another wonderful group of members attended the monthly meeting in February. The number of members in any organization is crucially important but it is equally important that members try to attend membership meetings and functions to the best of their ability.

It is most appropriate that during the month of February that has just passed, we talk a little bit about the feast of St. Paul of the Shipwreck. In Malta this is one of the most popular and ceremonial of all festas. It is celebrated in a big way in Valletta and among those attending usually we find, the president and prime minister of Malta and many cabinet members. Also, in attendance there are usually many members of the highest courts and other dignitaries. The festa Mass is celebrated every year by the of Malta. Our archbishop church dedicated to St. Paul of the Shipwreck located on Jamestown in San Francisco is without a doubt, a Maltese church dedicated to the patron Saint of the islands of Malta. The procession with the historic statue of St. Paul and the celebrations in the streets of Valletta, this year took place a day later because of inclement weather. The City of Valletta was totally en fe'te in a major way. It is written that in the year AD 60 St. Paul together with 274 men sailing from Crete to Rome on board a large wooden ship, were caught in a violent storm. After 14 days battling the seas, the ship ran aground in Malta. And according to historical accounts Malta became a Christian country because of this unplanned but yet historic visit by the apostle Paul. Malta is still a Christian country to this day, almost 2,000 years later.

Carnival in Malta 2025: This year Carnival was yet another spectacular event. The artisan craftsmanship is indeed a marvel. Many huge parade floats all decorated with synchronized lights, music, and dance troupes traversed through the streets of the capital city to the cheers and admiration

of thousands of Maltese people and visitors. The tradition of the carnival dates to the time of the Knights of Malta over 500 years ago. It is growing stronger and bigger every year. Weather permitting Carnival in Malta and Gozo is truly worth a visit.

Visit by Ambassador of Malta: As was announced in previous communications, the Ambassador of Malta, Dr. Godfrey Xuereb paid a visit to our club. This was his very first visit and the large crowd that packed the building is a testament of the vibrant Maltese community we have in the SF Bay Area. All other Maltese organizations were also in attendance as a show of support and cooperation. The comments received were extremely positive encouraging. The Ambassador, his wife and the accompanying delegation were also highly impressed by the fantastic reception he and his group received WELL, DONE.

Maltese Scholarships: The annual Maltese scholarship program has been launched earlier this year. There are several weeks left until the deadline, but time waits for no one. The scholarships are open to students of Maltese descent who are High School seniors or College freshmen, sophomores, or juniors. Maltese History Month

February 15, 1113 --- The Order of St. John is officially recognized by the Catholic Church by Pope Paschal II. This means the order is now protected by the Church and is allowed to elect its own leaders (Grand Masters) without answering to any other The order, founded in institutions. Jerusalem in 1099 during the Crusades, later becomes known as the Order of Malta and its ranking members as the Knights of Malta.

February 5, 1966 --- Derek Rossi is born in Toronto, Canada, the youngest of five children of Fred and Agnes Rossi, who immigrated to Canada from Malta. After receiving bachelor's and master's degrees in molecular biology from the University of Toronto, Rossi goes on to study in Finland, where he receives his Ph.D. from the University of Helsinki in 2003. For the next four years post-doctoral research he does Stanford University and then takes a position at Harvard University as an Associate Professor at Harvard Medical School. His most well-known claim to fame comes in 2010 when founds *Moderna*, the biotech company we all know today for developing a COVID vaccine used extensively during the COVID-19 pandemic of 2019-2022. Although no longer considered a disease of pandemic proportions, COVID is still active worldwide. Moderna has updated the vaccine several times to date to account for mutations which have occurred over time, helping to save countless lives.

Origin of Maltese Last Names

Is your last name **Zahra**? If so, you may be interested in knowing where your name comes from. **Zahra** is of Arabic origin. It is a female name which means "blossom" and is used in reference to a beautiful girl or woman. In Malta, the name dates back to at least the Middle Ages, i.e. the 1400s. It is sometimes spelled without the "h".
